

Event synopsis

Sweep of Platte River/Cherry Creek Bike Path

Recently, there has been an increase in reports of drug related activity along the Platte River and Cherry Creek Bike Path. To combat this trend and improve the quality of life for those who lawfully use this public space, a clean-up operation will be conducted on Wednesday, July 13th in the area between Districts 1, 2, and 6.

The clean-up operation will be performed from 0500-12:30 hrs followed by a BBQ for all officers/volunteers/residents.

Date: Wednesday, July 13th

Time of Clean-up activities for residents/volunteers: 7am-1p

Celebration BBQ to be held in Commons Park with local residents/business owners/employees between 12:30-1:30p.

Response plan

The Incident Commander will assign areas of responsibility, identify staging locations and outline strategies and tactics at a supervisory briefing on July 10 at TBD hours at District 1. The overall police mission is threefold:

- 1. To protect life and safeguard property;
- 2. To take law enforcement action when it is appropriate and in the public interest;
- 3. To improve quality of life conditions for those who lawfully use this public space.

Deployment Plan

Response personnel will be comprised of the following units:

- District 1, 2 and t 6 officers
- District 6 HOT
- Urban Bike
- District 6 DMU

Officers are advised to utilize safe handling procedures when patting down subjects, as there has been an increase of injection devices found along this area.

Uniform of the Day

All officers assigned to the incident will wear the standard regulation department uniform, with either short or long-sleeved shirts, and the authorized police jacket at their election OR the standard regulation department bicycle uniform if deployed on bikes.

Command Post

Communications



will be the primary radio channel and will be staffed by a dedicated dispatcher.

Video and Halo

A HALO operator will monitor the event from the HALO Command Post. All videos will be placed in property as evidence if enforcement actions are taken.

Scout Car

The Denver Sheriff Department will provide one dedicated Scout Car.

Emergency Medical Services and Denver Fire Department

A DHMC ambulance will not be pre-staged. Requests for medical services can be made per normal protocols. Denver Fire Department personnel may be called per normal protocol for decontamination.

Miscellaneous Procedures & Reports

After Action Reports

Arrest, Use of Force, and other pertinent event information will be reported to the Incident Commander as soon as practical. One comprehensive After Action Report for the event will be completed by Sgt Tony Martinez.

Use of Force Reports

Any officer deploying chemical agents or using force during the events will adhere to normal use of force reporting requirements. Copies of Use of Force Reports will be processed through established policy and procedures.
